This 12-month editorial calendar for *The Agenda* is aligned with BMF's marketing and campaign themes. Each month centres on a unifying theme to guide article submissions, contributor invitations, and thought leadership alignment.

- November: Leadership and Governance Ethical Practices for a Just Society
 Explore the role of ethical leadership and governance in creating a more just and accountable society, and the responsibilities of Black professionals in positions of influence.
- December: Reflecting on Progress Celebrating Black Excellence and Resilience
 Celebrate the achievements and progress of Black professionals. Highlight resilience, impact, and the shared journey toward a transformed society.

- January: Education and Skills Development Investing in the Future Workforce
 Focus on the importance of accessible, quality education and relevant skills development as
 foundational tools for socio-economic advancement.
- February: Health and Well-being Empowering a Productive Society
 Discuss the relationship between health, wellness, and sustainable progress. Centre the role of mental and physical well-being in building a strong, productive Black community.
- March: Social Justice and Equity Addressing Systemic Inequalities
 Tackle ongoing issues of inequality. Encourage bold thinking and solutions that move us closer to a fair, inclusive society.
- April: Technology and the Digital Economy Opportunities for Black Participation Interrogate how the digital economy can advance or exclude. Focus on the need for access, representation, and innovation in tech spaces.
- May: Intergenerational Dialogue Bridging the Gap for Collective Advancement Encourage knowledge-sharing and collaboration between generations. Explore how legacy, lived experience, and emerging leadership can come together to strengthen Black excellence.
